3. Health & Safety update led by DS	Point of note:  a. Covid files explained (everything has been documented)  i. DS explained the timeline from 'lockdown' to partial reopening and full reopening.  ii. BM asked if there have been any positive tests since reopening.  • DVW confirmed one member of staff from the Yr 10 bubble had to be tested but proved to be negative.  • The Yr10 provision was closed but we were able to keep the vulnerable provision open due to 'bubble' system.  • Have had a practise-run if we have to close a bubble in the future.  iii. Followed Government guidance, recommissioned rooms to increase teaching spaces – costly  iv. Bid to Government at the end of August for 'Covid' costs but no response so far (£43,000 bid) unlike other schools who have received their payment.	DS chasing 'Covid' bid money

#### v. Governors asked if students followed guidelines.

- DVW confirmed 95% compliance
- Some fixed term exclusions for students who purposefully flouted the rules after severe warnings.
- Only one parent had challenged ruling
- Some behaviours have been exacerbated by being out of school for 6 months
- All serious responses cleared with County and LM informed

# vi. Governors asked if strategies in place were having a positive effect on behaviours

- DVW confirmed yes overall but some were starting to escalate at the start of lockdown (3 x managed moves were in place but cancelled in lockdown)
- vii. As well daily Government guidelines there are guidelines from HSE, Ofsted and Public Health England
- viii. HSE/Ofsted are starting to call/visit schools to check on Covid prep and systems in place.
- ix. Remote Curriculum has to be ready to implement if any bubbles go into lockdown
  - JAT has put contingency work on SMHW which is aimed at individual students in isolation
  - Looking at other platforms if a whole year is put in isolation.

#### x. Risk Assessments

- Government guidelines followed but have to keep local issues in mind
- continually being updated as new issues arise (last ones were Food Tech Risk Assessment and pregnant ladies)
- Rearranged staff working areas for staff who are clinically vulnerable.
- Track and trace forms are completed for visitors and held by DS)
- All information can be found on the website alongside frequently asked questions to help reduce the number of calls to school.

### xi. Haven is now a teaching space.

- BM asked if there were any functions happening in the Haven as before. DS confirmed yes but restricted in number and time as rooms must be cleaned in-between appointments
- DVW confirmed support from the Haven is now more targeted than before.

# xii. SL asked how school meals worked.

- DS confirmed meals are being provided for FSM students
- Grab bags were provided to begin with but poor uptake.
- Students now able to go online and choose contents and uptake improved.
- Looking to roll out to other years (Yr7 and Yr8 from BCL and Years 9, 10 and 11 from the Hatch)
- Complaint from parent accusing us of making her child sit on the floor to eat her lunch. We are unable

- A lot of Yr 11 exclusions are hanging over from Yr10 so not a surprise – only 1 or 2 have been a surprise
- BM asked how many other schools have similar statistics.
   DVW has spoken to Cornish Heads and not similar as have better buildings/isolation rooms.
- i. Breakdown.
  - No of incidents broadly in line with year on year figures
  - Boys more likely to be excluded than girls
  - Disadvantaged slightly more likely to be excluded than non-disadvantaged
  - No exclusions for students with SEND/EHCP as reasonable adjustments in place – positive
  - 2 x PEx still left over from March due to Covid. New meeting scheduled for 8<sup>th</sup> October. Both students at alternative provision and doing well.
- k. Actions
  - Provision mapping software links into 'Class Charts' so everything shared with staff
  - Class Charts enables all information/evidence to be kept in one place – needed as a result of overturned PEx last year.
  - Targeted intervention support for Yr11 from 3 parttime staff not allocated to a tutor group
  - SEND Support Bases are being developed to provide more appropriate space which will hopefully be in use soon.
  - Ed Psych looking to support staff to have effective communication with students to help de-escalate situations and reduce confrontation
- Governors asked if they are doing everything that need to be doing. JAF confirmed yes
- m. Governors pleased staff to have de-escalation training and feel should be a priority.
  - DWV confirmed JAF looking into this.
  - Provision mapping helps this and if staff do not follow, they will be professionally challenged
  - JAF speaking to individuals as necessary and offering coaching and support with development conflict resolution
- n. LM asked if the proposed Governor Behaviour Panel which had been put on hold due to Covid was going to be set up.
- o. MW commented that term 'disadvantaged' was a wide brush stroke term used in schools and does school have a sense of backgrounds and look at more specifics.
  - JAF confirmed very aware that in Yr11 cohort there are significant numbers who have been exposed to domestic abuse in their younger years
  - School also aware of those at risk of being criminally exploited and is in regular meetings with local police/agencies to support these students
- p. LM asked if there are still staff who have had 'Trauma informed training' to work with children involved?
  - JAF confirmed yes but only in one bubble. Main support is via agencies.
  - DVW explained he had recently had a 'Team Around the School' meeting to increase support

P8 = 0.13 • Striking difference is improvement in Higher Achievers on last year • Only 6 students in the LA band so difficult to see if statistically changed • SL concerned over the use of P8 as a measure for the school as usually compare against previous years but can't compare this year as no exams sat. DVW confirmed P8 was a result of the modelling done so accuracy as a performance measure is unknown. • Grades seem to have improved by ½ grade ii.
